## Fees and Charges 2010/2011

#### **Report of the Strategic Finance Officer**

(This matter is the joint responsibility of Executive Councillors Slattery, Wilson and Prior-Sankey)

### 1 Executive Summary

1.1 This report sets out the proposed fees and charges for 2010/2011. The Executive is invited to consider the proposed fees and decide whether they should be recommended to Full Council for approval.

#### 2 Introduction

- 2.1 The purpose of this report is for the Executive to consider the proposed fees and charges for 2010/11 for the following services:-
  - Cemeteries and Crematorium;
  - Waste Services;
  - Land Charges;
  - Housing; and
  - Licensing.

#### 3 Proposed Increases for 2010/11

3.1 Appended to this report are the detailed proposed charges for each service as outlined above. The results of both the 2006 and 2007 public consultation events "Your Council, Your Views" clearly indicated that the public prefer to see increases in fees and charges, rather than in Council Tax, as a way for the Council to raise income. Therefore, where possible, fees have been increased to take these views into account.

#### 3.2 Cemeteries and Crematorium (Appendix A)

It is proposed that the main cremation fee be increased by £14 to £550. This will generate additional income of an estimated £30,800. Other fees have been increased by 2.6%, which will generate a further £5,000. Members should note that this increase is included within the Savings Delivery Plans elsewhere on the agenda and is ranked as a Category 2 saving.

### 3.3 Waste Services (Appendix B)

The garden waste collection service is not self-financing and relies on subsidy by those council tax payers not currently accessing the service. It is proposed to increase fees from £35 to £42.50, which is expected to generate approximately £60,000. The true cost is in the region of £48 - £52 per customer depending on take up rates.

- 3.4 Last year saw an increase in uptake of 227 customers, bringing the total participating to 8,555. The structure of the proposed charges for bulky waste collections has been amended to align them with the costs incurred through the collection contract and remove any subsidy.
- 3.5 The fees and charges proposed in this report minimise the net financial burden on the community as a whole by increasing revenues and controlling participation and therefore costs.

### 3.6 Land Charges (Appendix C)

As last year, given the current economic climate, it is proposed to keep land charges fees the same as in 2009/10. This coupled with the recent downturn in demand for the service should mean that the land charges service breaks even overall, which is in line with Government expectations, and which will be brought into legislation in the near future.

#### 3.7 Housing (Appendix D)

It is proposed to increase all charges by 2.5%. This is estimated to raise an additional £31,000.

3.8 Council housing rents will be set in the New Year once the subsidy determination has been issued by DCLG.

### 3.9 Licensing Fees (Appendix E)

Many fees and charges for licensing functions are set by statute, so increases under local arrangements are not possible. Those that are regulated in this way are annotated as such in the "Remarks" column in the Appendix.

- 3.10 An indication of the potential impact on income of the proposed changes for each licensing transaction is given in the column headed "Potential Impact". These figures are based on the number of such transactions that took place during 2008/09.
- 3.11 In recommending increases, account has been taken of continuing trading difficulties and of the need to avoid tipping the balance into diminishing returns of revenue that might result from imposing too high a level of charge. Additionally it is necessary to recognise that licensing fees are only to be used to recoup the reasonable costs of the Licensing Authority in administering the relevant licence. For this reason, "across the board" increases have been discounted in favour of examining each of the many licensing functions individually and on its own merits.
- 3.12 Members will note that fees for initial Grant and for Renewal of Sex Shop Licenses have been substantially reduced. The reasons for this are:
  - a) Solicitors acting for the sex shops have called into question the high cost of renewals and have suggested that they may pursue a legal challenge unless these charges are reduced to reflect the actual costs to the Council.
  - b) The advice of our Legal Services is that the Council may only charge sufficient fees to cover the costs of issuing the grant or renewal, and

associated enforcement. In so advising, account was taken of relevant case law, as set down in R. v Manchester City Council, ex parte King, 1991.

- c) In this case it was judged that local authorities were not permitted to regard licensing powers as an income-producing asset or to use such powers to increase general revenue. Therefore other commercial or market factors are entirely irrelevant, the licensing authority can only consider its own costs in relation to administering such licences.
- d) Although the Manchester case was concerned with the licensing of street traders rather than sex shops, it was referred to in Home Office Circular 13/2000. In the section headed "Basis for Licence Fees", the Circular states:-

"It has also been determined that local authorities are not empowered to raise revenue through a licensing scheme."

- 3.13 This shows that the principles set out in the Manchester case are relevant to other areas of licensing and they form the basis of the proposed new fees, coupled with increased knowledge and experience of licensing such ventures.
- 3.14 The history of compliance, has also been taken into account. This has been exemplary from both shops, resulting in much less frequent inspection than was required when the establishments were first licensed. This has resulted in less officer time being devoted to these premises, thus significantly reducing our costs.
- 3.15 Clearly, it is difficult to forecast increased income with any real accuracy and, in particular, the effects of the recession on trading habits are unknown and might skew such calculations as may be attempted.
- 3.16 To summarise, the maximum realistic revenue increase, allowing for the reduction in Sex Shop fees, is estimated to be in the region of £2,215.
- 3.17 Fees and charges for Car Parks will be considered at the Traffic Regulation Order Panel in December.

#### 4 Recommendations

4.1 The Executive is invited to consider the proposed fees and charges for 2010/2011 as set out in this report and to decide whether they should be submitted to Full Council for approval.
