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Somerset Early Supported Discharge for Stroke and Acquired Brain Injury

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What is Early Supported Discharge – ESD?

- Specialist MDT providing stroke rehabilitation at home
- Replicate the same level and intensity of therapy as would be provided in hospital, 7 days a week
- Promotes early transfer of care from hospital to home
- Patient led rather than medical led care
- Enables the patient to take responsibility for driving their own rehabilitation

Referrals Received for Patients within the West Somerset Area

- 13 referrals have been received since September 2016
- 12 referrals for Stroke patients and 1 referral for Acquired Brain Injury Patient.
- 9 of these referrals have been discharged home from Musgrove Park Hospital on to the ESD Service
- 2 Discharged home from Williton Stroke Unit on to the ESD Service
- 1 inappropriate referral



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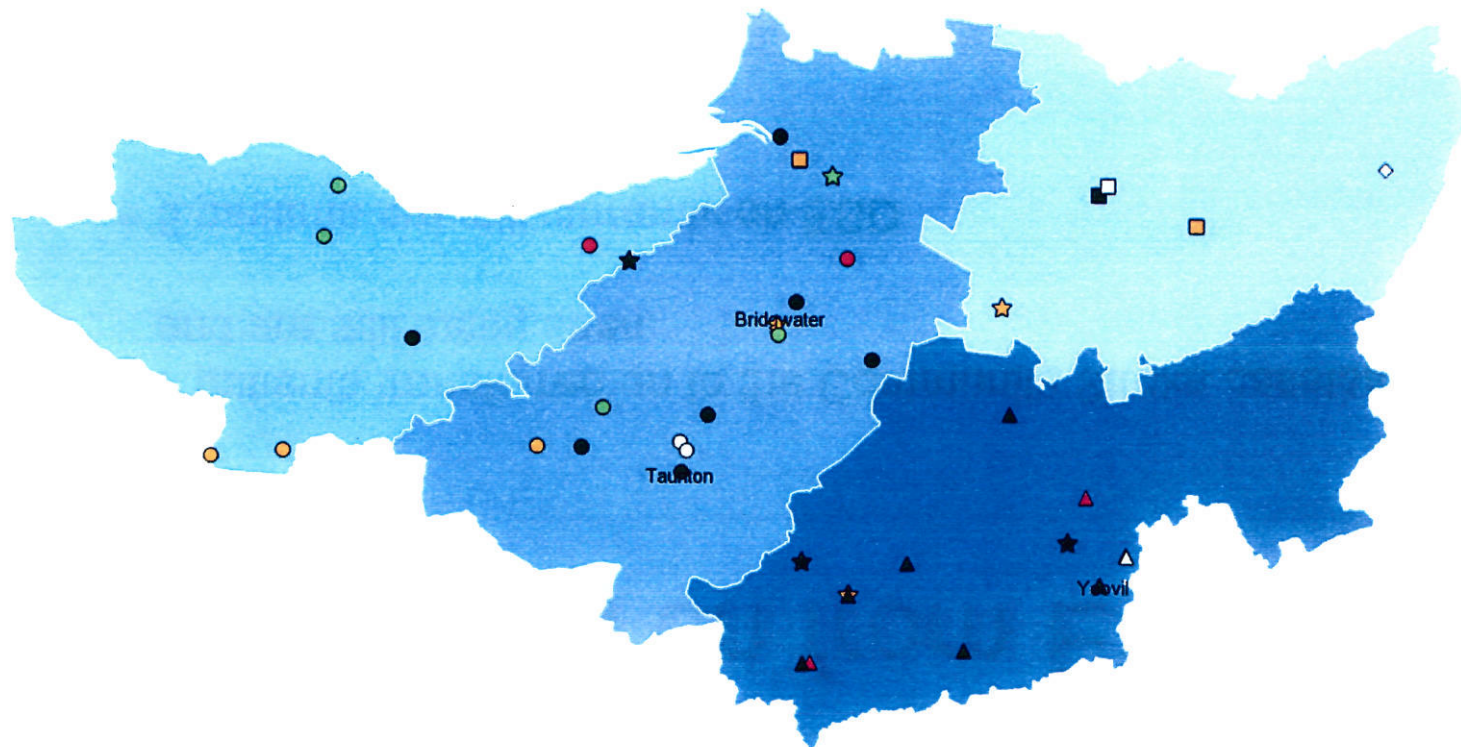
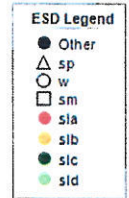
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Length On the ESD Service for the above Referrals

- 3 Patients required ESD for 2 weeks
- 2 Patients required ESD for 3 weeks
- 1 Patient required ESD for 4 weeks
- 1 Patient required ESD for 5 weeks
- 1 Patient required ESD for 6 weeks
- 5 Patients are ongoing and the longest stay for these so far is 5 weeks

- 7 patients transferred on to the Community Stroke caseload and are still being seen.
- 5 patients are still currently on ESD
