## Exmoor Area Panel Meetings items for discussion / community information by DSFRS.

#### Meeting Date: 09/06/2016

Location: Moorland Hall, Wheddon Cross

### Operational News for Community information relevant to the areas covered by area panel meeting (Remember Data Protection):

- Porlock crews have attended 19 calls since the last panel meeting. These have been 9 Co-Responder calls, 4 Heathland fires, 3 alarms operating, 2 Road traffic collisions and 1 assisting the ambulance service.
- Porlock station currently operates with 10 personnel, 1 Watch Manager, 2 Crew Managers and 7 Firefighters.
- Co Responders. Porlock still currently has 7 personnel who are co-responders and in partnership with South West Ambulance Service Trust, continues to offer assistance to life critical calls around the Porlock area.

### Community Safety news and activities within the areas covered by the relevant area panel meeting:

 Porlock station has been Co-Responding since the year 2000 and since then the Porlock Carnival committee and several local residents have donated money towards helping to buy essential lifesaving Co-Responder equipment. However in recent years SWAST has been responsible for providing all of the Co-Responder equipment we use so the monies collected over the years had sat unused in a bank account. The station felt that we would like to give this money back to benefit the community. On 11<sup>th</sup> May the Station presented Porlock Parish Council with a cheque for £1603 which is going to be used to purchase equipment for a community evacuation centre in the event of wide scale flooding etc.
