What is the proposal?



To replace Taunton Deane Borough Council and West Somerset Council with a single new district council (by early 2019)

- Keeps both areas whole;
- SCC unchanged;
- Existing Towns and Parishes unchanged;
- Electoral Wards would be reviewed by Boundary Commission – fewer district councillors.

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Background

2012 - WSC approach TDBC to explore working together. Both need to reduce costs - WSC to remain viable, TDBC to continue to invest in growth;

2013 – Joint Management and Shared Services (JMASS) business case approved. Saves **£1.8m** a year. ONE team;

<u>2015</u> – Hinkley B rates appeal - retrospective rate refund. Wipes out WSC JMASS savings.

<u>March 2016</u> Councils authorise production of high-level business case to explore transformation possibilities in three structural scenarios to address projected budget gaps (£2.5m TDBC and £1.2m WSC by 2020/21);

<u>Summer 2016</u> – both councils consider the options within the high-level business case and decide on preferred option to progress further.

Options considered

- Introduce new ways of working, continue to share staff, the two councils remaining as separate, democratically independent authorities (Saves £2.6m a year);
- 2. Introduce new ways of working, but have a single new district council, one set of officers and councillors serve the entire geographical area of the current areas (saves £3.1m a year an extra £0.5m a year over option 1 to further help protect valuable front line services and keep Council Tax at reasonable levels);
- 3. The two councils progress change on their own, a separation of the joint working arrangements, offering very different outcomes for the communities they serve, based on what the individual councils can afford.

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What about Unitary and Wider Sharing?

Open invitation from the outset to all Som councils. CEOs and Leaders have met.

What about a Unitary option?

- No current proposal from any of the Somerset councils;
- No time for lengthy discussions the WSC and TDBC need is pressing;
- A new district council doesn't prevent that in the future.

What about Sedgemoor?

- No detailed proposals put forward;
- Expressed preference for boundary commission route;
- Suggested a fresh start taking WSC/TDBC back 3 years No time for lengthy discussions;
- WSC and TDBC already closely working with Sedgemoor (Private sector housing, Building control, Waste, Audit etc) – A new council doesn't undo these partnerships nor prevent further closer working.

Why do we want control of our future?

- Government have made it very clear no extra cash for WSC or TDBC;
- Avoids solution being imposed;
- Our solution keeps West Somerset and Taunton Deane whole preserving sense of community and identity and delivers additional £0.5m per year – helping protect services;
- Maintains and enhances natural links between the two existing areas;
- Avoids unpicking of present management and staff sharing preserving the existing £1.8m a year savings from joint working which have been in place since 2013.

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Consultation

- 12th December to 28th February 2017; (early March for Parish Councils)
- Information gathering exercise to inform the <u>Secretary of State's decision</u> on whether to form a new council. The Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government is the decision maker;
- It is **NOT** about Transformation (working differently) as that is already underway;
- It is NOT a vote/referendum on whether a new council should be created.
