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Item 3	Updates					
	Williton Site visit					
	Cllr DD and Cllr IA thanked everyone (Niels McCartney, Richard Bull, Steve Hughes and Brenda Maitland-Walker) for attending the Walkabout in Williton to discuss flood risk, which they felt was very fruitful. The main area of concern raised by Cllr IA was that, should development commence following the outline planning permission for 350 houses that has been granted, the combination of water runoff from new housing and heavy rain could create a flood risk given the state of the West Williton Ditch. This watercourse also features in a longer-term flood scheme proposed by the EA.	CIIr D/CIIr A				
	There was discussion around the challenges and possible solutions to this. These included:	All				
	 A flood episode would impact on a key transport route to West Somerset. Williton is a larger than usual village and businesses serve a much wider population (IA) Highways gives "Standing advice" only on outline planning applications (BM-W) Planning committees which refuse applications on which the statutory consultees have made no comment run the risk of losing at appeal (IA) The EA Flood scheme is a long way off, but the ditch could be refurbished. There are updated funding formulae which may make EA action more possible. However, the designation as Flood Zone 1 limits EA's powers. The riparian owner is the developer. Surface water definitions must come from the LLFA (NM) Concern raised about the lack of staffing in LLFA and need for representation from LLFA, Planning and Highways within this group. Concern raised about lack of surface water mapping taking place (BM-W) There was a bid to SRA to fund an Officer to look at riparian ownership. Concern that this post was terminated (BMW) Staffing levels in some areas at both SW&T and SCC are potentially being affected by Unitary and recruitment is very difficult (DD) 					



- DD asked if a "quick and dirty" repair to the ditch could be achieved as amelioration, given the EA scheme is a long way off. There was discussion as to who would fund this (EA or SRA?) and who would sponsor and/or propose it (SW&T?; Williton Parish Council?)
- Is the SRA still funding enforcement? (BM-W)

The group went through the answers (in blue) to Cllr IA's questionnaire given to members at site meeting.

- Which organisation/landowner is responsible for the sluice gate on the Monksilver Stream?
 ACTION Steve Hughes to check with SWT Assets.
- Which organisation is responsible for the upkeep of the West Williton Ditch at its junction with Monksilver Stream? LLFAfalls to the individual riparian ownership.
- 3. There is a site that has outline planning approval for a new housing development, concerns on how will the surface water drainage will it be accommodated if an EA flood relief channel is built? This is complicated. No plans at present due to funding and cost but NM believe they are revisiting this
- 4. Are there any unsurmountable difficulties with constructing the flood relief channel between the locations 4&5? NM/RB: Not as far as the EA are concerned: it comes down to cost.
- 5. What can be done to restore the existing flood relief system including the West Williton Ditch? *Investigate riparian* contribution responsibilities and all organisations & authorities should work together to find solutions.
- 6. What is needed to promote the EA scheme beyond being "aspirational" to a high level of expectation of implementation? It all comes down to resource & cost.
- 7. Which organisation should take the lead with moving the EA project forward and seeking funding such as the levelling up grants provided from central government, S106 etc? Collaboration from all authorities should work together.

Invite Mike Rigby head of Transport in County to attend the next meeting ACTION MB

Is there funding available for the inspection maintenance of the ditch possibly look at SRA grants. ACTION MB to contact SRA about the potential to submit a bid for funding & invite SRA as a member of the Flood Board

The way forward

It was decided to pursue the possibility of refurbishing the West Williton Ditch and to invite representatives to this group from Highways (a replacement for David Peake), SRA (Caroline Dunn is keen to be involved but offered apologies for this meeting), Planning (could be difficult but Cllr Mike Rigby is Exec Member at SCC for Transport and PH for Planning at SW&T). Steve Hughes gave a brief update on the Blue Anchor Project.

- Licences have been granted from the MMO
- Rock armour has been ordered and will be delivered by barges.
- Contractor in place.
- Starting date to be confirmed.

Brenda expressed her concerns as there has been more landslip.

Steve reiterated this work is to protect the road only, although we are the Lead Authority on this part of the project it is up to County to decide a permanent solution.

Cllr A asked if he could have an update regarding riparian responsibilities in Sampford Brett, possibly a detailed map of who owns what. It was agreed that this had already been provided

Niels updated on Minehead strategic plan: SCC have a grant bid from the SRA supported by other partners (SWT, EA, WW, DB) to complete strategic flood work plan for Minehead.
