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Street trading consent

Consent Conditions:	
Standard consent conditions	
1.	Trading is permitted between the following hours only: Wednesday to Friday, between 8am and 5pm and Saturdays, between 8am and 4pm.
2.	The consent holder is responsible for cleansing of the trading area and ensuring that all refuse arising as a result of the activities are placed in suitable covered containers, unless otherwise provided by the Council. Such

refuse containers shall be kept as clean and disposed of in an approved manner.	
This consent or a copy of it, must be displayed prominently within the van/vehicle/stall/barrow/cart that is to be used.	
Provision must be made, as is necessary, to prevent any discharge of water or effluent from the street trading activity to any surface drainage or any other watercourse.	
Mobile generators must not be used.	
Any and all equipment used must be maintained so that it is in a safe working condition and if necessary, be cordoned off so that the public do not have access to it.	
All electric power supplied must be protected by residual current devices (RCD's)	
Any electrical cables or flexes used must be protected by rubber protection mats.	
Free standing heating equipment must not be used.	
Where appropriate, the consent holder must not cause or undertake any alterations to the surface of any council owned land or the Highway.	
The consent holder must not cause a nuisance to persons using the street (as defined in the Act) or occupiers of any nearby premises.	
Where appropriate, the consent holder must allow access for any cleaning, repairing or maintenance of the council owned land or the Highway.	
If revoked, this consent must be returned to the council as soon as reasonably practicable.	
Where appropriate, any van, unit or vehicle must be compliant with all relevant road traffic and highways legislation.
